

Big Pharma's Profit Plan: Make Americans Pay More.



Ozempic, a diabetes drug

- · Americans pay \$11,938.32 per year¹
- · Canadians pay \$3,607.31 per year²



Cyramza, a drug that treats stomach cancer

- · Americans pay \$16,313.28 per month³
- · Germans pay around \$6,000 per month



Caprelsa, a thyroid cancer drug

- · Americans pay \$297.43 per tablet⁵
- · Japanese pay \$55.42 per tablet⁶

Americans pay more than double the price for our prescription drugs.

The price of prescription drugs are 2.4 times higher for Americans than the average prices of other nations, per capita. If drug companies charged Americans the same prices that they charged other major countries around the world, we could save over \$1 trillion in 10 years.8 Big Pharma alone sets the prices for prescription drugs and is profiting off the backs of American taxpayers and patients.
